On TV the game show host for "Family Feud"drawls-out, "Surrrrvey Sezzz" and for us the results of our recent parish survey "sezzz' that the five most important activities that we want continued during our transition period are: Worship, Outreach, Fellowship, Education and Pastoral Care. We feel that it is most important that we maintain a schedule of weekly celebrations of the Eucharist. Second we want to maintain our outreach to the community through the BackPack program, North Porch, Seamen's Institute and the Deaf Ministry, as examples. Yes, we do like to eat and share time together and Family Breakfast and Coffee Hour are important to us. We want to preserve our Sunday School, Education for Ministry and expand our Youth Ministry. Finally, it is important that we provide pastoral care to our members.

We also answered questions about our greatest strengths and greatest challenges. We overwhelmingly see our strength as being a friendly and welcoming congregation who care for each other. Our ability to work together enables us to accomplish our outreach. Hands down, our greatest challenges are seen in the areas of finance and congregation growth. Many people ranked our mortgage as their primary concern.

The above results were based on a sample of 29 surveys plus two letters that were written in response to the survey. If these results are not consistent with your perceptions or feelings let one of your vestry members know your views.

There are various ways to have our own services for the other two Sundays such as having a Deacon's Mass as we did on June 29 when Betsy was away, or having Morning Prayer which can be led by any of our Lay Eucharistic Ministers. These are the types of discussions going on now at Vestry meetings and I know the Vestry would value your inputs!

SUMMER BACKPACK

As the end of the school year approached, my cell phone started to ring. "Are you doing the food program this year?" Last year we fed at least 240

children each GIVE with 300 children in total dependent on our program.

Every year we reach out to the community and businesses for volunteers and support. The Hackettstown area responded again with generosity. So far we have gotten donations of cloth bags from Fulton Bank, PNC Bank, Shoprite and CVS. Our bagels are donated again from our faithful supporters at Hot Bagel's Abroad and Valley Bagel. We will again be collecting fresh produce donations from Tranquility Farms and Weis Markets and also from new supporters' at Donaldson's Farm, Harper's and Godlewskys. We have gotten wonderful donations from food drives at schools: Allamuchy Elementary School, Walkill High School and Hackettstown High School. Weis Market continues as our partner for supplies providing us with donations, discounts and service.

St. James' parishioners are lucky to have created the Summer Backpack program. The program brings joy to so many children but also each year builds a great team of hard working, enthusiastic volunteers. This year we had a small but very hard-working group on the "management" team. This group negotiated great donations from our community. Our program explodes with volunteers for the fun and spirit filled SHOP, PACK and GIVE. "Management" volunteers are still needed to organize/supervise many SHOP and PACK days throughout the summer.

Our program has also worked side-by-side with North Porch Women & Infants' Centers. North Porch is an organization founded by the Episcopal Church Woman of the Diocese of Newark. North Porch provides emergency supplies for the care of babies: diapers, wipes and formula. Our St. James' Church has been a North Porch outpost providing care to Hackettstown moms for the past several years.
