This Month In Stewardship - December

It is Advent (Happy New Year!) Last week was In -Gathering Sunday, when all the pledges that have been returned were presented at the altar and when the Sunday School assembled 22 bags of food from the food along with \$25 "turkey cards" you donated for families in need. Thank you to everyone who donated groceries and who returned their pledge cards.

If you have not yet returned your pledge card, please do so as soon as possible. It is not too late. Be sure to consider both sides of the card: the side for <u>Time and Talent</u> and the side for <u>Treasure</u>. This is information that the Wardens and Vestry need for planning for next year. This includes planning for both our finances and the organization of our committees or groups.

For the three remaining Sundays in Advent there will be candy canes with gift requests for local families who are in need on the Tree of Giving. Some presents have been pre-purchased and can be retrieved from Paul Bartkus. If you pick one of these it will have "(See Paul)" on it. If you select one of these candy cane gifts, please see Paul about purchasing, wrapping and returning it. In any case, all presents must be returned by December 21st so that they can be transported to the schools for collection by the children's parents.

We will also be collecting food for our families for Christmas. The grocery bags with a suggested menu attached will be available in church and the parish hall for you to take. Please consider purchasing some of the items listened on the menu and returning them on or before December 21st so that the Sunday School students can sort the food and assemble the bags for our families. The \$25 "turkey cards" will also be included in the bags.
