THIS MONTH IN STEWARDSHIP

A letter attributed to St. James (James 1: 17-27) was read last week, Proper 17. There were two passages that I thought related especially well to our topic of stewardship. The first was from the very opening, "Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, is from above. . ." The second passage that struck my ears was, "But be doers of the word, and not merely hearers. . ."

These could describe the nexus of stewardship and discipleship. Please recall the simple definition that stewardship is everything we do with everything we have. This includes applying our talent, treasure and time to our ministries and lives. Being a disciple is about hearing the word and following it.

Our Summer BackPack Program is one of our parish's most visible ministries. It provides supplemental nutrition to food insecure children and families through the summer while school-based nutrition programs are not available. Giving food to the hungry is indeed perfect. It allows us to be doers and not merely hearers. We make a space available for receiving, sorting, packing and distributing the food bags: our treasure. We provide the organization of pulling it all together: our talent. And finally, we pack the bags after church on Sundays and receive and distribute the food on Saturdays: our time. As the summer concludes let us celebrate and give thanks to those in our congregation and beyond who not only heard the call, said, "Here I am, Lord" and generously gave the perfect gift of their participation. STEWARDSHIP UPDATE: CHAINS

AUDIT TEAM

Last edition of the Journal contained an article about our Bell Tower chains. You may remember that our five bells date back to 1903 and that a recent electrical repair had discovered that the chains were badly rusted and at risk of breaking.

Our tower houses five bells. The bells are actuated by a series of spring loaded levers and pulleys that carry chains to the bell clappers. The chains are attached to long wooden rods that run down (or up) through the tower to the five lever carillon behind the choir loft. When one of the levers is pushed down, it pulls a wooden rod that is attached to a chain that in turn is attached to the clapper. Then clapper then strikes the bell. Bong! Our carillon can play melodies using five tones. There are sheets of "music" above the levers which direct the player's lever choices. Ingenious turn-of-the-century technology!

The picture below shows how rusted and worn some of the old chains had become, especially when compared to a new chain of galvanized metal.

But it's not a "museum". Check-out the web page and I think you will find familiar programs that serve the community and similar worship goals we all strive for.


They even seem to be even heading into a transition phase, so I pray for them. I did not take an outside pic but the area around the church and the surrounding area were all stunning.
